

## RFQ Concrete Slab for King William Animal Shelter

**Scope of Work:** Prepare an existing exterior exercise yard to receive a suitable gravel base and concrete slab for a new concrete exercise yard. The existing yard is approximately 106' x 19' in dimension. Contractor chosen will clean and prepare the area and spread stone and concrete. Regional Animal Shelter is located at 20201 King William Road, King William, VA 23086.

Stone and concrete will be purchased separately by the County, but the contractor shall provide the labor. The fence around the yard will be removed and reinstalled by a separate fencing contractor.

### Details:

1. Existing line and corner posts are to be used for form dimensions and are approximately 106' x 19'.
2. All existing pea gravel in the exercise yard shall be removed and stockpiled on site for later use.
3. Existing filter fabric under pea gravel must be removed and discarded.
4. Certain end and middle fence posts can be removed or cut to facilitate ingress/egress for the removal of existing pea gravel TBD by owner and contractor. All posts removed shall be reused and bolted with a bottom plate in place or welded back into place by contractor.
5. Sufficient subgrade shall be removed and made ready for four (4) inches of #57 stone placed on subgrade and compacted into place to accept four (4) inch concrete overlay. Contractor shall install a form to accommodate stone and concrete.
6. Vapor barrier of 6 mil. poly shall be placed over new stone prior to application of concrete. Poly shall be provided by contractor.
7. Concrete slab to be poured in place with four (4) inch depth. Concrete shall be provided by County.
8. Concrete pad shall have a fall of two (2) inches from front to back. Concrete shall have a light broom finish.
9. Concrete pad shall be saw cut across the length at the midpoint and at every ten (10) feet from end to end throughout the width.
10. Contractor shall clean up all debris, and seed and straw any areas damaged by equipment or work.
11. Contractor shall have all proper licensing and insurance coverage required by County.
